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Purvis pulls in \$36M in two Navy support contracts

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A Middletown, R.I. technology services firm has been picked by the Navy to support its sub warfare center in the Ocean State.

Purvis Systems Inc. has won two contracts -- worth a combined \$36.7 million -- from the U.S. Naval Sea Systems Command (NAVSEA) Naval Undersea Warfare Center (NUWC) Division Newport.

The larger of the two contracts was issued for NUWC laboratory operations and maintenance services. This contract is expected to be completed by August 2012 and is valued at an estimated \$35 million, company officials said. Purvis Systems will serve as the prime contractor for the project, with subcontractors including Lockheed Martin Tactical Systems, Advanced Solutions For Tomorrow Inc. and Gryphon Technologies LLC.

The second contract calls for Purvis to provide program management and engineering services in support of NUWC's Ranges, Engineering and Analysis Department, and will include financial tracking, document management and meeting support. In addition, Purvis plans to deliver engineering services such as software and algorithm development support, software test verification and validation, test planning and logistical test support for research and development test and evaluation programs.

Expected to be completed by July 2009, this second contract is valued at an about \$1.7 million. Purvis Systems would again serve as the prime contractor, with subcontracting services provided by Northrop Grumman and Sakonnet Technology Group.

Purvis Systems clients include the New York City Fire Department, American Red Cross, Naval Undersea Warfare Center, the Surface Warfare Development Group.

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
